COB Wednesday, November 23	International collaboration on clinical trials  Interested delegations are asked to nominate new/additional members of the Experts Group that will carry out the extended activity for refining the risk categories, and for formulating OECD Council recommendations. Renominations of existing members are not required.
	International distributed research infrastructures  Interested delegations are asked to nominate new/additional members of the Experts Group.
	A study of the social and economic impacts of CERN  Interested delegations are asked to nominate experts to oversee the activity.
	Global risk modelling Interested delegations that have not already done so are invited to nominate members of the Experts Group that will, during the next six months, study the rational for, and interest in, global risk modelling.
COB Wednesday, December 7	OECD Committee on Scientific and Technological Policy (CSTP) Interested delegations are asked to comment on the CSTP Chair's Strategic Document.

	Decisions	The Global Science Forum accepted the final report and authorised its public release, pending review and approval by the Bureau of editorial corrections to be made by the Secretariat.
		The GSF agreed to the requested six-month extension of the activity for refining the risk categories, and for formulating OECD Council recommendations. Draft recommendations will be reviewed and discussed by the GSF prior to any submission to the OECD Council.

Actions	The Secretariat will finalise the report, seek approval by the Bureau, and will disseminate it in electronic and printed form.
	At an early date, brief Terms of Reference for the extended activity will be submitted to the Bureau for approval.
	Before COB Wednesday, November 23, interested delegations are asked to nominate new/additional members of the Working Group that will carry out the extended activity. Re-nominations of existing members are not required.

Agenda Item 5		Report and discussion on International Distributed Research Infrastructures
	Decision	The Global Science Forum agreed that the previously-approved activity should proceed, with an expanded Experts Group, and with modified Terms of Reference. The modifications should pertain to the definition and taxonomy of the distributed international research infrastructures that will be examined and analysed, as well as methodology of the analysis.
	Actions	Before COB Wednesday, November 23, interested delegations are asked to nominate new/additional members of the Experts Group.
		The Secretariat will prepare a summary of the comments from Bureau members and delegates to the 25 <sup>th</sup> GSF meeting.
		A face-to-face meeting of the Experts Group will be convened, following which revised Terms of Reference will be prepared and submitted to the Bureau for approval.

Agen	da Item 6	Report on the work of the Committee on Scientific and Technological Policy (CSTP) and its Working Parties
	Decision	The Global Science Forum took note of the CSTP Chair's Strategic Document, especially on potential output results of the future Programme of Work.
		The GSF agreed that its next meeting could include a one-day symposium to celebrate the 20 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the GSF, and it agreed that it would be desirable to combine this event with a commemoration of the 100 <sup>th</sup> session of the CSTP. The tentative date is Wednesday, April 18, 2012.
	Actions	Before COB Wednesday, December 7, interested delegations are asked to comment on the CSTP Chair's Strategic Document.
		The Secretariat will, in consultation with the Bureau and with representatives of CSTP, elaborate plans for the symposium. Before the end of 2011, the Bureau will decide whether the symposium should take place.

Agenda Item 7	Proposal for a study of the social and economic impacts of CERN
Decision	The Global Science Forum agreed that the activity should proceed, under the supervision of an Experts Group, and with modified Terms of Reference. The Forum required that the title be modified, that no external funds be accepted, and that, if feasible, the findings regarding CERN should be compared and contrasted with those relevant to other national high-energy physics laboratories, and perhaps one non-HEP international facility as well.
Actions	Before COB Wednesday, November 23, interested delegations are asked to nominate experts to oversee the activity.
	The Secretariat will contact delegations and scientific organisations to identify infrastructures that could be examined during the course of the study.
	The secretariat will prepare revised Terms of Reference for approval by the Bureau.
	A draft report will be submitted for discussion at the 26 <sup>th</sup> GSF meeting.
